

TEXT TO SCHEDULE FILE CONVERSION

Or how to change a Text file (txt) to a Schedule File (skd)
for Win XP, Win 7, and Win10

For WinXP, Win7, and Win10:

1. Open Windows Explorer and navigate to the folder where you want to put your skd file(s).

For WinXP and Win7:

2. Click the Tools menu item -> Folder Options -> View

For Win10:

2. Click the View tab -> Options panel -> View

For WinXP, Win7, and Win10:

3. **UNCHECK** the "Hide extensions for known file types" box.
4. OPTIONAL: **SELECT** the "show hidden files and folders" radio button.
5. Click the APPLY button.
6. Click the Apply to All Folders button.
7. Click OK.

Using Notepad or any other text file editor, create a Schedule file. See example below.

```
daily
start=00:00:00;
offset=200;
colorgain=3.0
bannerbottom=<DATE> < LGM SDRPlay2 TFD ARRAY LCP>;
savesps
stop=11:59:30;

start=12:00:00;
offset=150;
colorgain=1.5;
bannerbottom=<DATE> < LGM SDRPlay2 TFD ARRAY LCP>;
savesps
stop=23:59:30;
```

Save the Schedule file in text format (that is, with a .txt extension).

To convert the Schedule file in .txt format into a .skd file, do the following:

1. In Windows Explorer, right-click on the newly created schedule file (has a .txt extension).
2. Then click on "Rename".
3. Then change the extension from .txt to .skd.
4. Now right-click on the .skd file.
5. Select "Open" then select "notepad" from a list of programs.
6. **Ensure there is a checkmark beside: "always use the selected program to open this kind of file".**
7. Click OK.

Now Windows will allow you to edit the skd file using Notepad simply by double-clicking on the skd file. Make any changes desired to the text in the file, then hit Save and you are done.
